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Order of Luminaria

The congregation are asked to wait quietly before the service begins with the procession of the Dean of Chapel and the St Catharine's College Girls' Choir into the Main Court, singing:

1. O come, O come Emmanuel! Redeem thy captive Israel That into exile drear is gone, Far from the face of God's dear Son. *Gaude, gaude! Emmanuel Nascetur pro te, Israel.*

2. O come, thou Branch of Jesse! Draw The quarry from the lion's claw;From the dread caverns of the grave,From nether hell, thy people save.

3. O come, O come, thou Dayspring bright! Pour on our souls thy healing light; Dispel the long night's lingering gloom, And pierce the shadows of the tomb.

4. O come, O come, Adonai, Who in thy glorious majesty From Sinai's mountain, clothed in awe, Gavest thy folk the elder Law.

The Dean of Chapel prays:

Blessèd are you, Sovereign God, creator of light and darkness! As evening falls, you renew your promise to reveal among us the light of your presence. May your word be a lantern to our feet and a light upon our path, that we may behold your glory coming among us.

All respond:

Blessèd be God for ever!

The Luminaria fire is lit while the choir sings an ancient Christian hymn in the original Koine Greek from the 3rd or 4th century.

GREEK HYMN TO THE LIGHT Phos Hilaron

Φῶς ἰλαρὸν ἀγίας δόξης ἀθανάτου Πατρός, οὐρανίου, ἀγίου, μάκαρος, Ἰησοῦ Χριστέ, ἐλθόντες ἐπὶ τὴν ἡλίου δύσιν, ἰδόντες φῶς ἐσπερινόν, ὑμνοῦμεν Πατέρα, Υἰόν, καὶ ἄγιον Πνεῦμα, Θεόν. Ἄξιόν σε ἐν πᾶσι καιροῖς ὑμνεῖσθαι φωναῖς αἰσίαις, Υἰὲ Θεοῦ, ζωὴν ὁ διδούς· διὸ ὁ κόσμος σὲ δοξάζει.

O Joyful Light of the holy glory of the immortal, heavenly, holy blessed Father, O Jesus Christ. Having come to the setting of the sun, having beheld the evening light, we hymn the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, God. Meet it is at all times to hymn Thee with reverend voices, O Son of God, Giver of Life, wherefore the whole world doth glorify Thee.
