For those with a lot of musical experience and who want to take it further during their college career, there is the opportunity to apply for an instrumental scholarship or to participate in the college choir. Please register your interest by Monday 23rd September. We will arrange auditions at the start of the academic year. Whether you are an experienced musician wanting to pursue music at a serious level or would like to have the opportunity to take part in less formal activities, there will be ways for you to get involved in music at St Catharine's.
