





In an emergency, always let the Porters (01223 338300) know that you need an ambulance and dial 999.


SCENARIO 1: You experience symptoms



SCENARIO 2: You have no symptoms but a positive lateral flow test (LFT)



SCENARIO 3: You have no symptoms but get a positive result from the University's Asymptomatic Screening Programme






SCENARIO 4: You are self-isolating due to scenarios 1–3



SCENARIO 5: You have a confirmed case/symptomatic person in your household OR you are confirmed as a close contact by the NHS/University



N.B. Close contacts in the same household as the affected person should **postpone all non-emergency visits** until no-one in the household is isolating. Close contacts living elsewhere should tell potential visitors to their own home what has happened (while respecting the privacy of the affected person) in case they prefer to reschedule.

SCENARIO 6: You are a possible close contact of someone not in your household (2 days before they had a positive test or up to 10 days after)
